#### **EB & WGSR**

- <u>Launch</u> of the *Towards Cleaner Air: Scientific Assessment* Report
- Request to elaborate a draft 2018-2019 Workplan
- Recommended <u>further integration</u> of activities under EMEP and WGE, and <u>closer cooperation</u> between centres and TF
- Invited the ad-hoc policy review group to highlight issues regarding LTS
- Encouraged Parties to consider <u>providing resources</u> for the long term financing of the effects oriented (CCE and TFrN)
- Acknowledged the financial contribution by France, Germany, Sweden, Switzerland, Nordic Council of Ministers and Norway to the CCE 2017 activities

## **Coordination Centre for Effects**



- Financial support by Dutch Government since 1990. Expires in 2017
- Financing solution for 2017 activities: 170.000€ aprox from Sweden, Switzerland, Norway, Nordic Council, Germany (+trust fund +TF leader country (FR)
- Long term solution requires:
  - (i) Sustainable funding
  - (ii) A leader Party to take over the responsibility for the center No alternative before 2018-2019

- According to recommendations from Policy Review Group (PRG)
- ➤ Biannual workplan → Biannual deliverables ??

  (1st year global report?, 2nd year specific report?)
- Workplan: Activities not included in the Mandates Linked to concrete objectives and deliverables

Convention activities would be defineb by:

- TF Mandates
- Biannual workplan
- Brief synopsis of activities (integrated, comprehensive, highligthing interlinkages....)





- ➤ In 2018-2019 work plan should be further simplified and shortened, driven by the conclusion of the PRG
- The work plan should be easily readable, concise, presenting clear objectives
- Interlinkages between various entities and groups should be highlighted
- ➤ The deliverables and results proposed in the work plan should be achievable in the two years period and correspond.
- They should be realistic considering available resources (whatever the source)
- Interest and use for the policy makers should be highlighted





## ..... and PRG recommendations (ECE/EB.AIR/WG.5/2017/3)

- i. Enabling sound policy decisions
  - 1. Human health effects
  - 2. Integrated environmental policy
    - Ozone nitrogen effects on C sequestration, biodiversity and other effects
    - b. More experimental ecosystem research (dose-response, parametrization, model validation)
- ii. Maximizing the impact of the Convention and its protocols (including review and updated of Protocols)
- iii. Improving the technical and scientific basis
  - 1. Improving the functions of WGE and EMEP:
    - Access to data
    - Integration of work and reporting
  - 2. Linked, multipurpose CLRTAP monitoring
    - Closer links between Atmospheric monitoring and Effects monitoring
- iv. Improving communication, outreach and cooperation





#### ..... and PRG recommendations (ECE/EB.AIR/WG.5/2017/3)

- Better combine (or connect) effects and concentration/deposition monitoring
- Intensify cooperation between EMEP and WGE groups and within each bodies; propose objectives shared by several groups
- Cooperation with other organizations through concrete projects is essential as cooperation outside the UNECE region
- Increase visibility and availability of data produced by the convention

"EMEP, the Working Group on Effects and their subsidiary bodies including the ICP are requested to systematically improve access to data via the internet, and to establish a common web-based portal, as indicated in the workplans (short to long-term)"





#### Next ....

- WP should be discussed at the EMEP SB/WGE joint session (Progress of work discussed at the EB bureau meeting in May)
- ➤ WP should present a list of deliverables with the time line, CLRTAP bodies involved, other partnerships, resources allocated. 2-3 objectives per entity (ICP, TF, Centers) is foreseen
- Distinction between:
  - Improving tools to assess air pollution and its effects in the UNECE regions
  - Cooperation with Parties
  - Cooperation with other projects and bodies (« outreach »)
- They should be discussed at the groups 'annual meetings and sent to the WGE and EMEP SB chairs by the 20<sup>th</sup> May
- Iteration between the chairs of various entities until 15<sup>th</sup> June to consolidate the WP





# Should not include « yearly mandatory actions »

Yearly actions related to mandatory work will be described in the revised mandates

#### For example:

- ➤ **Assistance** to Parties: collaboration with them in the evaluation of the data and results, training workshops (except pilot studies)
- > **Development and improvement**: Models, methodologies (incl measurement)
- ➤ **Provision of**: model results (air pollutant concentration and deposition maps, S/R matrices ...), emission data, measurement data
- Interpretation and evaluation : measured and modelled data (for both EMEP and WGE)
- **Evaluation of the implementation**: of the monitoring networks (EMEP, WGE), of emission reporting processes...
- > Quality assurance and quality control: for all kinds of data
- > **Dissemination**: Update databases and websites
- ➤ Annual status reports and country reports, Annual meetings of TF and the ICPs
- > ...

2017: Starts the review of the WGE ICPs, TF-Health and JEG Dynamic Modelling

  - Guidelines for reporting on the monitoring and modelling of air pollution effects (ECE/EB.AIR/2008/11; ECE/EB.AIR/WG.1/2008/16/Rev.1)
  - Long-term Strategy for the CLRTAP
  - Bi-annual workplans for the implementation of the Convention

## NEC Directive 2016/2284



## **Article 9: Monitoring air pollution impacts**

1.Member States shall ensure the monitoring of negative impacts of air pollution upon ecosystems based on a network of monitoring sites that is representative of their freshwater, natural and semi-natural habitats and forest ecosystem types, taking a cost-effective and risk-based approach.

## Document prepared by European Commission with data submitted by ICPs

"Document on the overview of CLRTAP ecosystem monitoring"

- Asses the extent to which current monitoring under the LRTAP ICPs meets the requirements of the Directive (Annex V)
- Available information on historic and current monitoring
- Environmental compartments of interest freshwater, natural and seminatural habitats and forest ecosystems (including integrated monitoring)
- Geographical coverage, frequency of sampling, participation by MS

**Needs** identified by COM to meet the requirements of the Directive:

- Increase the monitoring sites to ensure ecosystem representativity
- Increase the participation in each of the relevant networks (ICPs)
- Maintain the funding of the ICPs and the CCE

.....to be reinforced

## Strengths of our WGE Monitoring Network (and modelling)

- Specific monitoring of air pollution impacts (S, N, O<sub>3</sub>, HM, POPs)
- Fresh waters, forests, (semi-)natural vegetation, crops
- Co-location with Natura 2000 sites
- Harmonised methodologies and manuals
- Historical data sets
- Annex V indicators + additional ones
- Cost effective and Risk based
- Linked to EMEP monitoring and modelling

#### Weaknesses

- Not enough territorial coverage, ecosystem representativity
- Not (yet) a single joint network
